IOIN OUR FIRST FOOD CREW



GETTING TO KNOW:

IN LOVING MEMORY OF LYNETTE DOEPKE

(Lynette Doepke was our January "Getting to Know You" special article. We wanted to still publish this in her honor and memory.)

"It seems that people like to feel the need to describe children in terms of "she's just like her mom/dad." If that was the case for me, I'd be honored if you said that I am just like my dad. I certainly did not inherit all of his genes, but he definitely passed his musical ability to me. I sang my first duet in a Christmas program at the age of three, cut my first (and only) record about the same time, and won my first vocal contest in the third grade. I wasn't the most diligent student and mostly messed around until my teens. Most of my future successes can be attributed to much more self-study as an adult and Dad's genes. During school years I began to sing in many groups and performed as a soloist. Those years I was toiling away at the piano and organ keyboards. I began playing for church while in high school and played for my first wedding ceremony then. (I wish I had made a list of them.) I served as permanent or substitute organist at every church I attended except one. I branched out to accompanying school and church groups and the ball kept rolling until I retired ten years ago and counted the years sitting on that bench as fifty. I've had some wonderful experiences during that time and made some life-long friends. Because of several physical problems I can no longer sing or play well, but I carry with me many warm memories." ~ Lynette Doepke
