

Spiritual Growth Group Ideas for Autumn/Winter 2021: Starting sometime this fall, Rev. Myers is planning on leading a group of adults, members and non-members, that are looking to grow spiritually in their faith. There are many different options and formats that would be possible for this group, so we need your input – those of you who would be interested in such a group. Below is listed some of those options:

- 1) A book study/dialogue session on one of your favorite books, or one that you have been wanting to read, that would be conducive to spiritual growth. Rev. Myers can share a list of possible books if you don't currently have one in mind.
- 2) A topical or thematic in-depth study of a particular Christian concept (e.g., love/loving-kindness, forgiveness, reconciliation, grace, compassion/mercy, faith, hope, justice, peace/shalom, integrity, etc.), or social issue (e.g., capital punishment, poverty/income inequality, sexual orientation/identity, militarism/war/violence, hatred/prejudice, welfare, environmental stewardship, genetic engineering, universal healthcare, white privilege/fragility, mass incarceration/penal system, etc.).
- 3) A study of one or more of the World's Religions (e.g., Hinduism, Judaism, Buddhism, Jainism, Sikhism, Taoism, Shintoism, Islam, Bahai, etc.) and how it/they relate/s to Christianity.
- 4) A Bible Study of one or more books of the Bible or Apocrypha that involves critical reflection of the texts in their context then, as well as spiritual edification for our own lives today.
- 5) A "Haven of Healing Group" where we share our own stories with one another and support each other in our effort to see ourselves as recipients of God's grace.
- 6) A Music, Art, & Poetry Share Group where we share our own works, or those of others that have touched our spirits, with one another and discuss the meanings we perceive through these mediums of creativity.
- 7) A "Soul-ercise" aerobic activity and meditation group that exercises, relaxes, and meditates to instrumental music, and may or may not spend share time in conversation after the exercising/meditation.

8) A Seekers Discussion Group where those who have doubts about certain elements of Christianity, Religion, etc., come together to pose their questions and comments to the rest of the group and listen to each other's varying responses – hopefully helping each person to find organize their own thoughts and ideas in ways that lead to spiritual growth.
9) A study group that either reflects on the upcoming week's Lectionary texts, or prior week's Points to Ponder, Nourishment for the Journey, and/or Sunday Message.
