

CEDAR VALLEY LITTLE PANTRIES

Our church will be supporting families in the Cedar Valley by helping to keep 4 little pantries stocked 1 time per month. ANNUAL FALL CLOTHING GIVE-AWAY


Thanks to everyone who contributed to the clothing drive last weekend, especially Diane, who transported items from FCC to First Baptist and helped
